### What is the Tenant Board Member Ballot?

### How to vote

- Postal Voting will take place between Wednesday 21 May 2008 and 12 noon on Wednesday 4 June 2008, the results of the ballot will be announced at the Company's Annual General Meeting on 31 July 2008.
- You should vote for any **TWO** of the four candidates that are standing by marking the box next to their name with a 'X'
- Return your ballot paper by 12 noon on Wednesday 4 June 2008

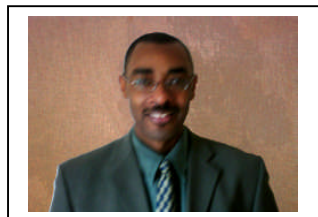

and forums, as well as a Community Centre secretary. Locally I am involved at my local Community Centre, LAG and Area Panel.

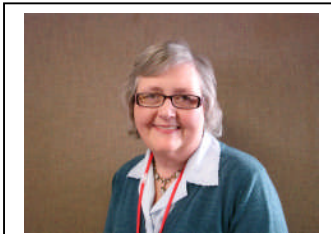

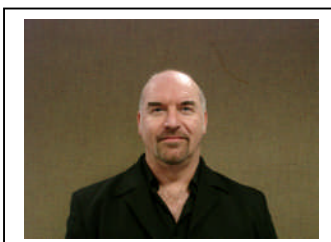
I would like to become a Board member in order to represent people in my community to make their
