According to the Autumn 2008 Census on ethnicity in schools in Nottingham is:

White or White British	65%
Mixed	9.5%
Asian	14.1%
Black or Black British	8.3%

Particular schools indicate:

Manning – Aspley – 51% white
 Fernwood – Wollaton - 64% white
 Bluecoate – Aspley/Wollaton - 48% white
 Greenwood Dale - Sneinton - 56% white
 Djanogly – Sherwood Rise - 39% white

The other schools have much higher % of white pupils.

NCH provides work experience for all of these schools apart from Greenwood Dale who have not come forward with any request – so we will be contacting them regarding some outreach work.

2) 14-19 year old Construction Diploma

The 3 schools within the City of Nottingham that are centres for delivering the **14-19 year old Construction Diploma** and with whom we will continue to work closely with Property Services are:

- Big Wood School – Bestwood – 79% white
- Haddon High Park High School – Bilborough – 82% white
- Djanogly Construction Academy – 39% white

There is also a focus on:

- Attracting females in construction - Manning School for Girls – Aspley – 51% white.
- Attracting students with a disability – Westbury and Shepherd School – Aspley.

4) Looking Ahead....

Ethnicity - Outreach Work

We recognise that with 20% BME on work experience this % needs to increase to reflect the number of BME students in secondary education in Nottingham.

Work experience placements are requested directly from schools and NCH accommodates these requests most of the time. The school request determines the ethnicity of the students and outreach work at the schools with higher BME students will be scheduled in 2009/10 to attract more requests from BME students and more apprentice applications.

Emphasis has been largely on the construction side of the business so there will also be an emphasis on finding suitable work experience placements in Housing Services and Support Services.

100% Inner City Placements

Although there has been a focus on inner city placements, going forward there will be 100% inner city placements including those longer term placements from Stephenson College for Property Services Tackling Worklessness initiative.

In line with the company's push on Equality and Diversity there will also be a push for BME / female in construction placements. The team will give priority to schools with high BME/female students and on those schools delivering the 14-19 Diploma in Construction.

Tap the Gap

Tap the Gap is the Council's flagship positive action programme offering talented city school leavers, from BME communities, Looked After, or with disabilities the opportunity to gain between two and four weeks voluntary work experience across the Council during the summer holidays.

In 2009 Tap the Gap are working with eight city schools, who have selected students, who will not only benefit from the experience, but who are also high achievers and ambassadors for their schools.

Nottingham City Homes will be offering placements.

Key Dates - The induction will take place on 27th of July at the Council House and placements will run for two to four weeks from this date. The Celebration event will be taking place at the Council House on the 15th September at 6.00 pm.
